Call when...

 Situation is stable and student poses no imminent danger to self or others.

 Student has thoughts of harm to self or others.

Student is interested in additional support, including safety planning and resources.

You are unsure of what support is needed.

Tell the student...

"The PGCC line is available to support you 24/7. In person and virtual services are available M-F 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m."

Call when...

Student is in visible distress, but no active danger is present.

Student is expressing strong suicidal thoughts.

Student has a plan to end their life.

Student may qualify for an involuntary mental health hold (unable to care for self, intensifying thoughts of suicide or homicide with plan and intention).

Tell the student...

"Whenever MCRT is contacted, UPD is informed but does not typically accompany response."

Call when...

Situation poses imminent danger for student or community; intensifying suicidal or homicidal thoughts.

Weapons are present.

 Student is displaying aggression or hostility.

Student is intoxicated and unable to care for themselves.

Student has medical concerns.

Tell the student...

"Support has been contacted and they are on their way."
